#### **President's Report**



Hello everyone.

Unfortunately, from the Associations perspective, we have been severely hampered by our ever-present problem child, Covid. In the June edition of the Clipped Wings, last year, we paid tribute to an Air Dispatcher, none of us ever met, Mr David McDonald, who had his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday on 9 July 2020. David was one of the original Air Dispatchers during WWII in New Guinea. His daughter, Lee, notified me that he passed away on 1 August 21, just three weeks after his 101<sup>st</sup> birthday. He was in a nursing home in the Lake Macquarie area.

#### **President's Report**

On the 10th of July, I was contacted by the President of the US Red Hay Chapter, Mark Michel. The US were supposed to host the 2022 International Parachute Rigger/Air Dispatcher Reunion in the US. A number of suggestions were made as to when and where the reunion should be held, however, due to the pandemic and travel restrictions globally, it was decided to postpone the reunion for at least 12 months so at this stage, it is planned for the Fall Season (Sep – Nov) 2023. More to follow.

ANZAC Day this year, we were honoured with a detachment from the squadron and the Basic AD Course members from AMTDU. In June, I had the privilege of attending the graduation ceremony for the Basic Course and the concurrent Crew Commanders Course. PTE Todd Houston was Student of Merit for the Basic Course and PTE Daniel Craighead was Student of Merit for the Crew Commanders Course. Well done and congratulations to everybody who completed their respective courses and welcome to the trade.

Just recently there has been a number of discussions regarding the Parachute Rigger Trade and the Air Dispatch Trade amalgamating to an organisation similar to the US Rigger Trade. The jury is still out on which Corps we shall be, but I am aware that two Air Dispatch soldiers have already begun training in the Rigger field. I have also been approached by Phil Thamm, President of the Australian Parachute Riggers Association, in regard to the possible amalgamation of our associations. From my perspective, I believe it would be a good thing, strengthening both associations, which would benefit all members. This is only in the suggestion stages at present, with nothing in place or planned. In my opinion, if it were to occur, it would not be until the Army Trades amalgamated and there was an overall approval from our members

The association was also contacted by Mr Ian Carroll, Ex Fight Engineer with 38 Sqn. Ian is a member of the Historical Aircraft Restoration Society (HARS) Caribou Flight, based at Albion Park Airport (just south of Wollongong). Ian came to us with the possibility of ex and current Air Dispatchers assisting the HARS Caribou Flight with people for open days etc, explaining the airdrop role of the Caribou. We are also looking at assisting HARS with dummy loads for display purposes and possible photo boards explaining the Army involvement. Those interested in the Caribou Flight and historical military aviation, please contact me for details.

Finally, I must mention the passing of John Barnet. John was a National Serviceman who served with Lou Heidenreich many years ago. John passed away on 11 November last year. Unfortunately, we were not aware of Johns passing until just recently and neglected to include him in ours Vale section. Our condolences and apologies go to Rosemary and the family.



#### Support for ADF firefighters due to start in September

Email Publication from RSL NSW 27 August 2021

**Dear Members** 

As a part of the 2021–22 Budget, the Federal Government allocated \$6 million in support of Australian Defence Force (ADF) personnel who participated in fire training at Royal Australian Air Force Base Point Cook Fire Training School between 1 January 1957 and 31 December 1986.

These personnel were potentially exposed to a range of toxic chemicals at a time when personal protective equipment standards were lower than today.

The Scheme will provide eligible personnel with:

- simplified access to compensation and treatment for a list of 31 specified conditions, under the Safety, Rehabilitation and Compensation (Defence-related Claims) Act 1988;
- screening for colorectal cancer and melanoma, for early detection and prevention; and
- individually tailored lifestyle advice under the 12-month Heart Health Program.

The ADF Firefighter Scheme is scheduled to begin on 20 September 2021.

#### **David McDonald**

David Gordon McDonald

9 July 1920 - 1 August 2021



Mr David McDonald

David was born in Lismore NSW in 1920

He was the second of 10 children – 4 boys and 6 girls. All four boys served in the armed forces (3 in WW II and one in Korea).

The family came to Sydney when he was about 5 years old, and they initially lived in Milsons Point in the shadow of the Sydney Harbour Bridge which was being built at the time. His father (who was at Pozieres during WW I) worked as a rivet catcher on the bridge.

He initially tried to enlist in the Air Force, but later went into the CMF (Citizens Militia Force). He enlisted in the Army on 5<sup>th</sup> January 1942.

He trained at Greta and went to New Guinea on the SS Taroona, landing at Port Moresby in May 1942. During the New Guinea campaign, normal transport resupply was impossible in forward areas. To overcome this problem, resupply by air was the only successful way to get supplies forward. 1, 2 and 3 Air Maintenance Company's were formed for this task mainly from the ranks of the Australian Army Service Corps but also volunteers from other units. David was eventually allocated 3 Air Maintenance Company. These units

went on to be affectionately referred to as the "Bully Beef Bombers" and finally the "Biscuit Bombers".


David discharged from the Army on 8 July 1946. The day before his 26<sup>th</sup> birthday. What a great birthday present.

He married Phyllis Collins in 1951, and they had two children, David and Lee. He worked as a carpet layer and lived in Ashfield for about 50 years where he was heavily involved with Ashfield RSL; being a board member for many years including stints as Vice President. He is Life Member number 2 of that club and attended 66 consecutive Anzac marches held by the club.

David and Phyllis moved up to Coal Point near Toronto on Lake Macquarie (not far from the former Catalina base at Rathmines). Phyllis, passed away in 2015 and David was living independently until he had a fall at home in 2017 which fractured his skull and resulted in him having to go into residential care. He was still driving until he was 96.



Lee contacted the ADAA just prior to David's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday and our Vice President, WO1, Anthony Eddie organised a number of mementoes for him





On Monday, 2<sup>nd</sup> of August, I received this email from his daughter, Lee Pilgrim

Hi Nick,

I just wanted to let you know that my father, David McDonald, passed away yesterday, 1st August at 3pm.

He had a turn early last week and declined from there. He went peacefully and we were with him.

He turned 101 on 9th July. Last year when he turned 100, you published an article in your newsletter about him and his exploits as a Biscuit Bomber in New Guinea.





I want to thank you for helping to make his 100th birthday something special.

The last picture I have of him is holding the AADA poster which I bought for his 101st birthday. I have attached it FYI.

#### **Denis Foster**

Denis Michael Foster 8 July 1935 – 23 June 2021



Denis was born in West Riding of Yorkshire, England in 1935

He was schooled at Bradfo<mark>rd Grammar and be</mark>gan his dedication and commitment to Service at a very young age as a schoolboy in The Combined Cadet Force.


He entered full time military service at the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst in 1953, graduating in 1955 and commissioned into the Royal Army Service Corps. Denis served with the British Army on the Rhine (BAOR) and in Southeast Asia during the Malayan Emergency with 55 Coy (AD) RASC. Here he met Peter Blyth and Bill McMahon who were tasked with setting up the AD wing at the RAASC Centre, Puckapunyal.

In 1959, whilst in Kuala Lumpur, he met a young lady named Jean Embrey, a Lieutenant in Queen Alexandra's Royal Army Nursing

Corps. They were engaged and married in 1961

In September 1964, Denis resigned his commission in the British Army and enlisted in the Australian Army and, with his background, was immediately posted to RAASC. He served in different postings such as Puckapunyal, Walgrove and Holsworthy. He resigned from the Regular Army in 1969 and transferred to the CMF where he remained till 1975.

After leaving the Regular Army, he was the manager of Cranbrook School, Bellevue Hill in Sydney, till 1977 where upon he joined the Public Service, retiring in 2000. He was also a Justice of the Peace NSW from 1976 till 2006.



Denis had a long-term connection with the Scouting movement rising to the rank of

District Commissioner. He also supported numerous Jamborees and was QM for the UK Contingent to the 10<sup>th</sup> World Jamboree in the Philippines.

He joined Brisbane Water Legacy in 2002 and was elected to the Board in the same year, serving as President and Chairman 2003/2004, and later as Company Secretary. Denis retired from the board in 2015 having faithfully and efficiently served under three presidents.

Amongst his many achievements he developed and presented an Aide Memoir for Legatees working with people with disabilities. This program was adopted nationally by Legacy.

This is a proud record of service spanning nearly 70 years






Denis will be sorely missed

Denis had a wonderful singing voice and had been a member of various choirs including the Selangor Philharmonic in Malaya and a Member 1982-2002 and Past President, Sydney University Graduate Choir. At our last International Reunion (2020), on board the Ruby Princess, we watched Denis perform with other passengers in the ships cruise choir. He was also a member of the Central Coast Choral from 2002 till his passing

He leaves behind Jean and a son Mark, a daughter Susan, grandchildren Adam & Samantha and great grandchildren Isabella and Ava; plus a host of friends.



#### Vale

#### John Lindley Barnet



This is a belated Vale for John Barnet as John sadly passed on 11 November last year and we were unaware of his passing until recently.

John was born in Gawler, SA on 23 October 1945 and was the eldest of 4 boys. He went to school at Gawler primary and briefly Gawler High, before going to Prince Alfred College. After a year at Adelaide University studying Economics, he decided this was not for him as his heart lay in journalism and a degree in Economics was not going to fast track that. And so, he opted for Cadetship with the Adelaide News. Journalism was always in his blood, John's great grandfather, William Barnet was the original founder and editor of "The Bunyip" newspaper in 1863,

in the Gawler area of SA. "The Bunyip" was a family run business and John going into journalism was only a matter of destiny.

In 1968, John was called up for National Service and did his basic training at 2 RTB, Puckapunyal. On completion of his basic training, he completed the Basic Air Dispatch Course at the Air Dispatch Wing then posted to 40 AD PL, 1 ASSO at Walgrove. Lou Heidenreich described him as a "smart, wise, and very funny man. As a young bloke he was a guiding hand and a good mate in a time when I could have gone 'off the rails' as a young Adelaide boy living in the big smoke of Sydney". After completing his National Service commitment, he returned and worked at the Adelaide News.





John and Rosemary married on November 24, 1973.

It was not long after returning to Adelaide, he had the opportunity to work in Sydney as sub editor on The Mirror and whilst in Sydney, he met his soulmate, Rosemary Stephens. John volunteered at Adelaide and Monarto Zoos for 15 years from early 2005 until mid-2020. Rosemary was on Adelaide Zoo staff over that time. So, they spent their days at the zoo with John guiding and assisting visitors and Rosemary working in administration.

John and Rosemary had 3 daughters, Belinda, Jodie and Meg and now have 10 grandchildren. Sadly, John didn't survive to see the latest twin girls, but knew they were on the way. He was very, very proud of his 10 grandies- 9 girls and 1 boy.
